## New Rules for Watching WMYSA Games by Mark Schatz

Beginning this fall, MSYSA and WMYSA are requiring that parents and spectators watch the game from the same sideline as their team's players and coaches, unless the soccer facility prevents it.

The Portage Soccer Complex has an agreement with neighbors that spectators will be on the sideline furthest from the property line. Thus players from both teams should be on the far side of the field as before, and parents and spectators will be on the near side of the field (closest to the paved walkway) for games in Portage. At most road games parents will be expected to watch from the same sideline as their players.

The purpose of the new rule is to make it easier for coaches *"to control their spectators on their side of the field, and see that their fans*

*or spectators behave in a proper and respectful manner."* We're confident that Portage spectators will behave properly even when they're across the field from their coach.

## Treasurers Report by Bob Lopez

I would like to update our membership as to the status of the different financial accounts that I oversee for the club, including their purpose and current balance. They are as follows:

### General Operations Account

This account keeps the kids playing every week. All the PSC fees are deposited into this account and from this account our major expenses include coaches and managers stipends, uniforms, field rentals, WMYSA fees, USF fees, and referee fees.

I oversee this account directly and the current balance is \$42,082.51 This account has the largest balance this time of year right after player fees are collected

### Portage Community Soccer Complex Acct.

This account was established to maintain our new field's complex. The income into this account comes from field rental fees. We currently rent these fields to AYSO 74, the Sting soccer club and Portage Soccer Club. To date our major expenses to the complex include fertilizer applications, insect control and repair and maintenance of the sprinkler system.

Over the past three years of operation the club has saved thousands of dollars in lawn mowing costs and maintenance labor due to the efforts of our volunteers, including the lawn mowing and stripping team of John Calnin, Mike Flynn, Verne Genisio, David Rice, Brian Campbell, and Dennis Huczek.

I oversee this account directly and the current balance is \$2,940.20

### Fundraising Account

This account was established as a base to start our fundraising programs. Funds from this account help offset any unexpected costs that the club may encounter and any surplus of funds go toward the reduction of the mortgage for the construction costs of the Soccer complex.

Kathy Brown manages this account and the current balance is \$10,046.41

### Portage Soccer Classic Tournament Acct.

This account is used for the operations of the club's tournament. The tournament is the club's main fundraising activity. This year the tournament was able to donate \$20,000.00 to the club to help pay down the mortgage created for the construction of the soccer complex.

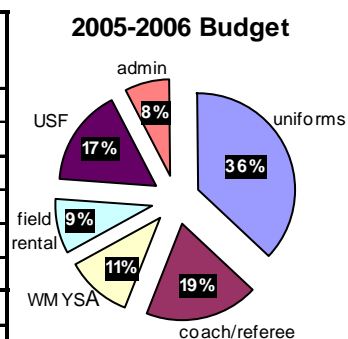
Beth Elliston manages this account and the current balance is \$9014.51

At our year end (July 31) I reconcile all of these accounts and present them to the club's accountants, Siegfied/Crandall, who reviews all these accounts, completes our tax forms and prepares our year end financial statements

When you visit the Portage Soccer Complex this fall you will notice a new addition. A granite soccer ball and pedestal now grace the entrance to the buildings. The soccer ball is a gift to the PSC from Gary and Karen Crankshaw in memory of their son Andrew who was killed in an automobile accident in January 2003. The Crankshaw's requested that memorial donations be directed to the PSC and that we consider a memorial to deceased PSC players and volunteers.

At the time there was no plan on what to do as we explored various ideas for a memorial. Our first goal was to honor Andrew and two other deceased PSC players, Brian Thiele and Jim McGough. Mike Williams of Sign Art, Inc., who designed and donated all the signage and flag poles at the complex, was enlisted for his creative talents. After several preliminary designs we settled on a granite soccer

ball with matching engraved panels. One panel is "Portage Soccer Club remembers" and has the names of these three young men. A second panel "Portage Soccer Club remembers" honors Maureen Norman, the co-founder of the Portage Soccer Tournament.

The remaining two panels have a special saying engraved on it:

"May this special place touch you as you pass and fill you with pride, determination and a desire to always give your best."

It is our hope that many generations of PSC players will stop as they enter the complex, touch the soccer ball for good luck and stride confidently onto the fields to do their best.

The soccer ball pedestal was dedicated on June 26, 2005 in a ceremony attended by family and friends of the deceased.

# USF Update on River Oaks Park

The long awaited improvements to the River Oaks Soccer Complex, the second component of the United Soccer Foundation (USF) capital campaign, are complete just in time for the start of the fall season. Improvements include the construction of four junior size fields, a combination restroom/concession building adjacent to the fields and paved parking lots for over 600 vehicles. The \$600,000 price tag was funded by a State of Michigan grant (\$250,000), Kalamazoo County (\$100,000) and the USF (\$250,000). These improvements follow earlier improvements including the installation of an irriga-

tion system and the reconstruction of fields 6 and 7.

River Oaks is home to A.Y.S.O. Region 212, the River Oaks Soccer Club and several adult leagues. A.Y.S.O. Region 212 and the River Oaks Soccer Club are members of the USF together with the Portage Soccer Club, Portage Soccer Classic Tournament, A.Y.S.O. Region 74 and the Sting Soccer Club. Each group has collected player fees earmarked for the construction of new or the renovation of existing soccer fields in Kalamazoo County.
